# Teen Spirit

## At the Maccabi games, teens meet & compete

They may have only had a week of practice together, but you wouldn't know it judging by the success of the Posnack JCC's Team Ft. Lauderdale Boy's Baseball team. The team, ages 13-16, brought home the gold in the baseball division of a recent mini-Olympiad for young Jewish athletes. Wayne Stofsky says his team's success was based not just on talent, but how well they came together as a team in a short period of time.

"It was just a group of kids that really got along well and had great camaraderie," said Stofsky of Cooper City, who's been the head coach of the Posnack JCC's Maccabi baseball contingent for three years. This was his team's first gold medal.

The ball players, many from Weston, Cooper City and Davie, went 6-0 during the Maccabi Games, which were held August 5-10 in Memphis, Tennessee. Posnack JCC's Team Ft. Lauderdale sent a delegation of 94 teens from South Florida who competed not only in baseball, but also swimming, soccer, basketball, tennis, table tennis, lacrosse, track & field and dance. The week-long experience also included an opening ceremony, community service mitzvah projects and social events in the evenings.

"It is about competing, it is about camaraderie, and it is about giving back," said Stofsky.

Since 1982, the games have provided a venue to encourage Jewish pride and identity through sports. The 94 teens from South Florida, the largest single delegation, joined close to 4,000 thousand other Jewish teens from all over the country, Canada, Israel, Mexico, Great Britain and Hungary. While there is competition, the games are also about strengthening bonds in the Jewish community. While coaches stay in local hotels, the young athletes stay with host families who welcome them into their homes.

Harrison Riggott, 14, made his first trip to the games this summer to play tennis. The Cooper City High school freshman lost his match in the second round, but says there was plenty more for him to experience.

"I liked all the activities and all the tennis, I met a lot of kids and my host family was very nice. Overall, I really enjoyed it," he said.

The South Florida delegation also included an impressive array of coaches and supporters, including baseball coach Stofsky, who is the President of the Cooper City Optimist Club and played college baseball for LSU, winning the College World Series. Others included Dale McLean, who works for the Miami Heat and oversees the Heat Extreme Dancers; Federico Brodsky, owner of Swish Hoops Basketball Camp, who played professional basketball for Argentina and is a basketball recruiter for the "Haifa Heat" team; Kenny Anderson, former NBA basketball player; Dan Newman, President of the Posnack JCC; Debby Eisinger, Mayor of Cooper City; and Sammy Schulman, the CFO of the Miami Heat.

Schulman become involved three years ago and is the head coach of the 16-and-under Boys Basketball team, which includes his son, Benjamin, 15. Schulman says the games are about the total experience, where Jewish competitors from around the world have the chance to connect.

"They become immediate friends and have the ability to stay in touch. I think it is a great experience," he said.
